Director's Message

Dear Parents,

I wrote last week about the systems and process which we use whenever we have a positive case within the school. It turned out to be good timing to explain the situation, as over the weekend, we did have some additional positive cases in the school. I know that both the Senior School Principal, Steve Thompson, and the Primary School Principal, Marie Green, wrote to the parents in their sections to explain the current situation. We do not want to bombard parents with Covid-19 notifications, but we do want to be clear and transparent about what is taking place within the school. I hope that we have got the balance right.

There was an interesting article in the Qatar Peninsula newspaper this week quoting Mohammed Al Bashri, Adviser to the Minister of Education and Higher Education, saying that recorded Covid-19 infections are less than one percent in schools and that therefore there is no need for schools to close. I have seen similar advice about schools in the UK saying that there is very little transmission of infection within schools. This makes sense to me. Schools are well-ordered and regulated environments where students and staff follow the rules. In this case, that means students and staff do wear their masks properly, they do maintain social distancing, they do wash their hands regularly and they also use sanitizer regularly. If we maintain these protocols, we will all be safe.

I continue to encourage you to send your children to school for blended learning, so that they can learn with their teacher in person, for at least half of the week. The evidence indicates that students do learn best in that environment and also have the additional benefit of social interaction with their peers, which is so important in term of personal wellbeing and social development.

I hope that you and your family are keeping safe and that you will have a good weekend together.

Dear Parents,

What an interesting ten days it has been.

As you are aware we had 4 positive cases of Covid last week and 143 students, plus 9 staff were tested. I am extremely pleased to announce that NONE of the results of the tests have come back positive. Everyone tested negative. I would also like to share that there have been zero transmissions of Covid in the Primary School and that though unfortunate, all cases have been brought into the school from outside. With a student body of 948, this is pretty remarkable. It goes to show how safe, clean and socially responsible, every member of our school is being. I would like to thank all of our parents for being so proactive, caring, understanding and socially responsible. What a great community effort.

ASAs / Clubs

Thank you for your ongoing support of our 'precautionary pause' for in-person ASAs/Clubs. We are hoping to restart ASAs/Clubs the week of February 28th. Please check SchoolsBuddy for ASAs/Club updates and information. For paid Clubs, the two paused sessions will be added to the end of the term.

In summary: There are 3 Virtual Book Fairs where book selection and payment is all done from home online. Families pay direct to the vendor and the school is not involved in this.

There are 4 Author Presentations and Author Book Sales: 3 presentations are in English and 1 is in Arabic. Families pay for any orders direct to the vendor or payment on delivery to the home.

How will school help with Authors: Author Presentations can be shown in school or at home and classes and students can participate by clicking on the link. Master copies of the order forms will be shown in Library sessions.

How will school help with the Virtual Book Fairs: Library sessions will allow access to the full range of the Book Fair titles virtually and computers will be set up for student perusal.

We have just submitted our final application to become an eco-school by applying for the GREEN FLAG Award. I will keep you posted!

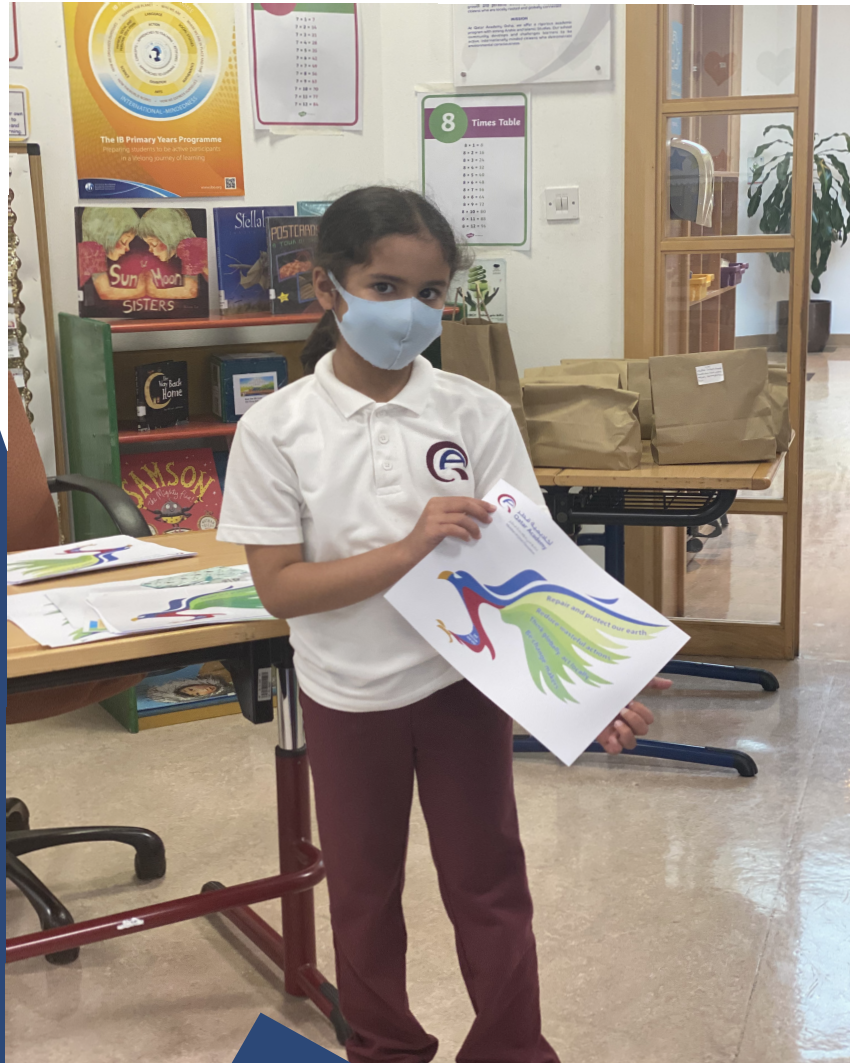

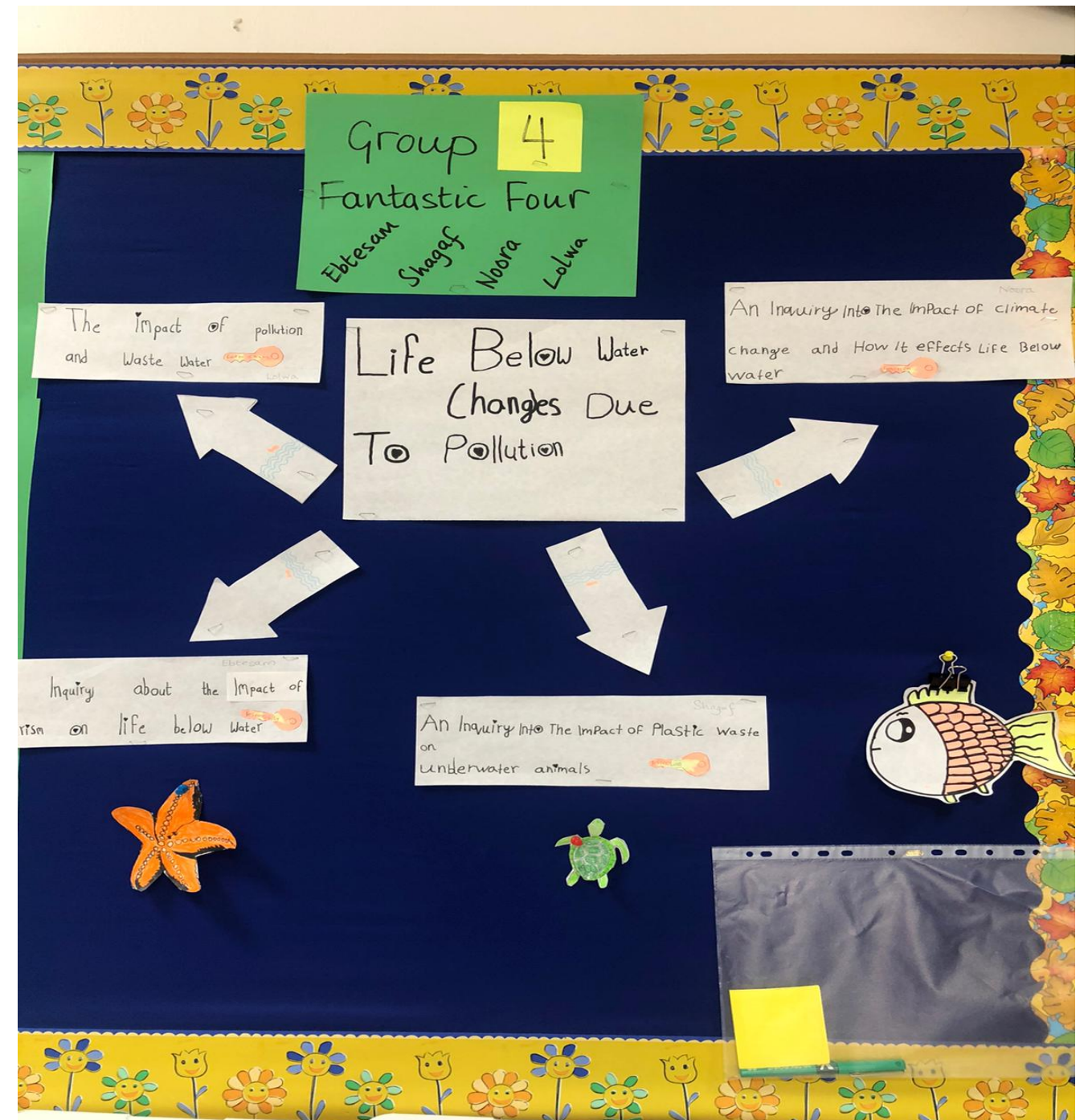

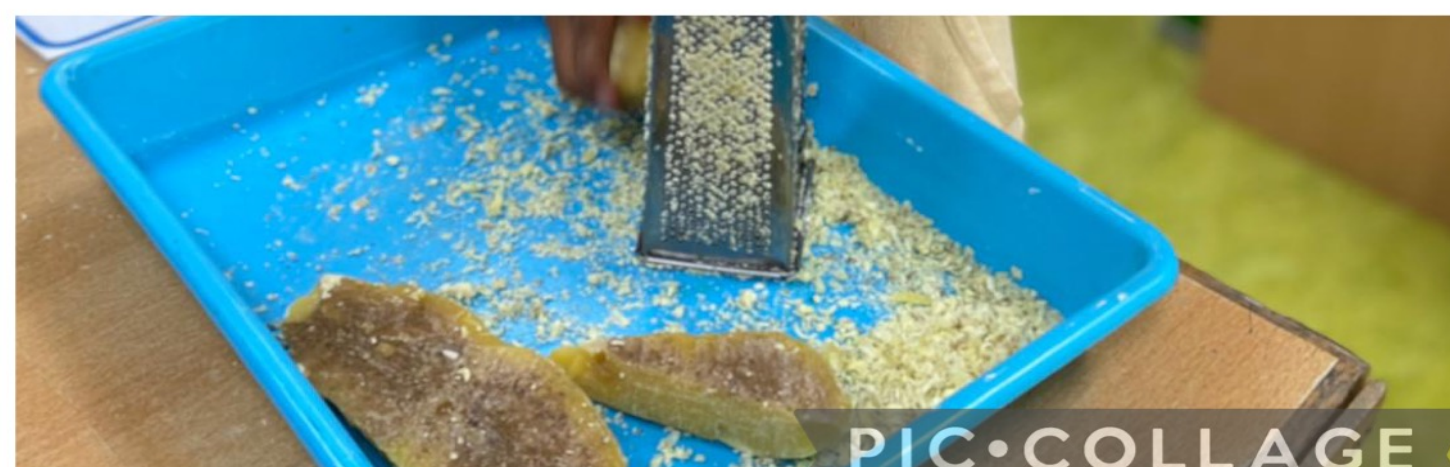
Conceptual Understanding Empowers
