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

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

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Grade 2

In our current unit, Grade 2 students are learning that different kinds of living things in ecosystems depend on each other. We were lucky to have two experts come to present at our weekly assemblies.

Firstly, Miss Aisha, Environment Specialist, taught Grade 2 about mangroves. She explained about where they are found, how they protect the environment, and about their unique ecosystems. Students also learned about the mangroves in Qatar and the threats to our mangroves. Miss Aisha explained that Qatar is home to the Avicennia Marina species; it is known as the gray or white mangrove tree. The oldest and largest mangroves can be found at Al Thakira and Al Khor.

Next, Mr. Jamie, a bee expert, joined our assembly to talk about the importance of bees. We learned that bees don't want to sting you because they will die and bees help plants to grow by pollinating them

Students were so engaged during both presentations. Both presenters complimented the Grade 2 students for their interesting questions and observations.

- Ocean pollution gets easily caught in the roots of the Mangroves and hurts both the plants and animals living in the ecosystem.
- Mangrove forests are often cut down to make room for tourist attractions or building developments because of the ocean front location.

Handwashing

The COVID-19 pandemic provides an important reminder that one of the most effective ways to stop the spread of germs and stay healthy is also one of the simplest — handwashing with soap and water.

Handwashing is an easy, cheap, and effective way to prevent the spread of germs and keep kids and adults healthy. When your family is healthy, you don't have to worry about missing school, work, or other activities

Washing hands prevents illnesses and spread of infections to others

Handwashing with soap removes germs from hands. This helps prevent infections because:

- People frequently touch their eyes, nose, and mouth without even realizing it. Germs can get into the body through the eyes, nose and mouth and make us sick.
- Germs from unwashed hands can get into foods and drinks while people prepare or consume them. Germs can multiply in some types of foods or drinks, under certain conditions, and make people sick.
 - Germs from unwashed hands can be transferred to other objects, like handrails, tabletops, or toys, and then transferred to another person's hands.
- Removing germs through handwashing therefore helps prevent diarrhea and respiratory infections and may even help prevent skin and eye infections
